Keeping my eyes squeezed shut and my mind stuffed full of Roar, I start to crawl further into the mattress. Left hand, right hand. I see Mitch – her blue hair trailing behind her and tattoos of bubbles floating up her arm. Left hand, right hand. I smell the bonfire and popcorn smell of Win's cave. Left hand, right hand. Somewhere at the back of my brain, I register that I should have fallen onto the attic floor by now, and that this is taking far too long, but I push the thought away and I see Roar's night sky crammed so full of stars it looks like rainbow glitter had been thrown across black velvet.

There were millions of stars in Roar – blue, green, pink, purple – and their light was as warm the sun. Those stars used to shine down on me and Rose when we floated in Mitch's lagoon. They made patterns on our skin.

I freeze, snapping back to where I am. Something has changed. I hold my breath and feel around. My hands aren't pressing into a soft and spongy mattress any more. They're touching something rough and hard.


The mattress has gone.






Mira reached out to pat Dave's nose but he put his ears back and snorted loudly. She pulled her hand away.

I want to pull out my camera from my bag but Samson nudges me with his nose. He seems upset. His body is tense, not relaxed. He nuzzles my hand again, pushing it forward and further down between the grasses and that's when I touch it – something like a finger.


Then I feel the hand and the arm. Now I'm sure.







And sometimes, when I think back to the days before the horror, I find it almost impossible to remember the 'me' I used to be – the child, the teenager, the girl who wasn't like this. It's as if she never existed. I'll be lying awake at night, staring into the darkness, trying to picture her . . . trying to remember how she looked, how she was, how she felt about things . . . and nothing of her will come to me.

All I'll see is all I am.

A faceless face, encaved eyes, a skull, bones, blood . . .

All I am.


I kiss her on the forehead and my tears sink into her skin.
