


Now Nicholas must tell his dad that the dinosaur is the brave one, not him. But his dad gets it. All guys feel afraid now and then. That's just the way guys are.


"What if . . . we got lost far, far, far away, and couldn't find our way home?" "Then we would become the bravest explorers in the world."

THE STORY OF FERDINAND has inspired, enchanted, and provoked readers ever since it was first published in 1936 for its message of nonviolence and pacifism. During World War II, Adolf Hitler ordered the book burned in Nazi Germany, while Joseph Stalin granted it privileged status as the only non-communist children's book allowed in Poland.

The preeminent leader of Indian nationalism and civil rights, Mahatma Gandhi, even called it his favorite book.

The story was adapted by Walt Disney into a short animated film entitled *Ferdinand the Bull* in 1938. *Ferdinand the Bull* won the 1938 Academy Award for Best Short Subject (Cartoons). A new animated film adaptation from Blue Sky Studios (creators of *Ice Age, Rio,* and the *Peanuts* movie) and directed by Carlos Saldanha will be released in December 2017.




One day, Mama said, "Ernestine, I need you to do a job for me."


"I know if we had a fire, I would miss my aprons," Mama explained. "So I've decided to make Ms. Temple one."

In 2016 she was announced as the Damon Knight Memorial Grand Master, given by the SFWA for lifetime achievement in science fiction and/or fantasy. Her works have been translated into Albanian, Chinese complex, Chinese simplified, Danish, Dutch, Finnish, French, German, Greek, Hebrew, Hungarian, Indonesian, Italian, Japanese, Korean, Portuguese, Romanian, Spanish, Thai, and Turkish.
